The parcels consisted of seven paper packets (F, G, I, J, K, L, M),  
 eight envelop (N, O, P, Q, R, S) and two glass bottles (U & T)  
 which were sealed with impressions of a seal corresponding with  
 the seal impression forwarded and the parcels N, O, P, Q, R,  
 S were also sealed with CALCUTTA POLICE MORGUE and the rest  
 were sealed also with the seal of Bhowanipore P.S., Calcutta.

## Description of article contained in parcel.

The envelope (D) contained one elastic fitted torn, white printed Panty. One long and two short length's hair were found adhere to it. The Panty bore brown and greyish stains at places.

The paper packet (F) contained one elastic fitted white, torn under garments bearing dark brown stains and few greyish stains at places. No hair could be found on F (under garment)

The paper packet (G) contained one pink colour shirt bearing dark brown stains at places. No hair could be found on G(Shirt).

The glass bottle (H) contained some colourless liquid said to be control saline water. It was soaked in a bandage cloth for use as control of T for Serological examination. The paper packet (HI) contained some cotton-wool bearing dark brown stains partially. The unstained portion of cotton-wool used as control.

The Paper packet (J) contained one English News Paper cutting bearing dark brown stains partially. The unstained portion of news paper used as control of same.

The paper packet (K) contained a piece of sponge bearing brown stains all over and some unstained cotton-wool instead of control of J.

The paper packet (L) contained one metallic neck chain approx. 18" in length.

The paper packet (M) stands contained one orange/black printed handkerchief in wet condition.

The envelope (N) contained a tuft of hair said to be the scalp hair of victim girl collected by autopsy Surgeon.

The envelope (O) contained one test tube containing a stick of wool bearing brownish/yellowish stains appears to be vaginal swab of Hetal Parekh.

The envelope (P) contained a pair of glass slides smeared with brownish stains said to be vaginal smears of Hetal Parekh.

The envelope Q & Q1 contained a small piece of dark brown stained blotting paper and one piece of unstained blotting paper said to be blood soaked in blotting paper and its control respectively.

The envelope (R) contained pieces of nail cutting collected by autopsy Surgeon, said to be victim girl.

The envelope (S) contained pubic hair said to be of victim girl collected by autopsy Surgeon.

The glass bottle (T) contained some dark brown liquid said to be blood in saline water. It was soaked in bandage cloth for Serological examination.

#### RESULTS OF EXAMINATION.

Neither spermatozoon (No semen) nor gonococcus could be detected in the vaginal swab (O) and smear (P) said to be of Hetal Parekh.

No semen could be detected on the exhibits marked G (Skirt) & M (Handkerchief).

Semen too small for determination of its origin and group was detected in the exhibits marked D (Panty) & F (Under garment).

No significant of foreign material other than blood too small for determination of its origin and group could be detected in the contents of the envelope marked R (Nail cuttings).

Blood too small for determination of its origin and

group was detected in the exhibits L (Neck chain & hair), O (Vaginal Swab) and P (Vaginal smears).

Blood was detected in the exhibits marked D (Panty), F (Under garment), G (Skirt), I (Cotton-wool), J (News paper cuttings), K (Sponge), M (Handkerchief) Q (Stained Blotting paper) as well as in the content of the glass bottle marked T (Lark brown liquid).

Semen was detected in the content of the envelope marked S (Public Hair).

Regarding the origin and group of blood in L, F, G, I, J, K, M, O & T and origin and group of semen in S, the original report is enclosed.

No. 8662/MLR dt. 25.10.80 from the Serologist, Govt. of India, 3 Lyd Street, Calcutta-16, is enclosed.

On morphological Examination, the strands of hair found adherent to panty contained in the envelope marked D and the ~~several~~ strands of hair contained in the Paper packet L have been identified to be human scalp hair and both of them (D & L) appear to be dissimilar from each other. They (D & L) also appears to be dis-similar from the sample human scalp hair contained in the envelope marked N.

Opinion on other point will follow.

## Result of analysis

The number noted below refer to my numbers.

Item Nos. 22, 23, 24, 25, 26 and 29 noted above are stained with human blood.

The blood stains on the item No. 27, 28 and 30 are disintegrated and their origin cannot be determined.

Item No. 31 noted above is stained with human semen.

## REPORT ON BLOOD AND SEMEN GROUP.

Item No. 23 is stained with M 'B' GROUP BLOOD.

The blood and semen group of the stains on the items noted below could not be determined for the reasons stated:-

Item Nos. 22, 24, 25 and 29 : Not sufficient for test.

Item No. 31 (Semen) : Not sufficient for test.

Item Nos. 27, 28 and 30 : Disintegrated.

Item No. 26. : Result of test inconclusive.
